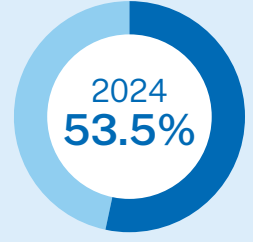
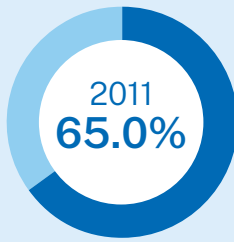
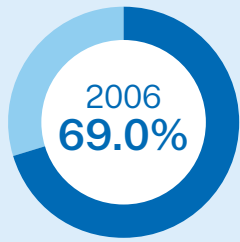


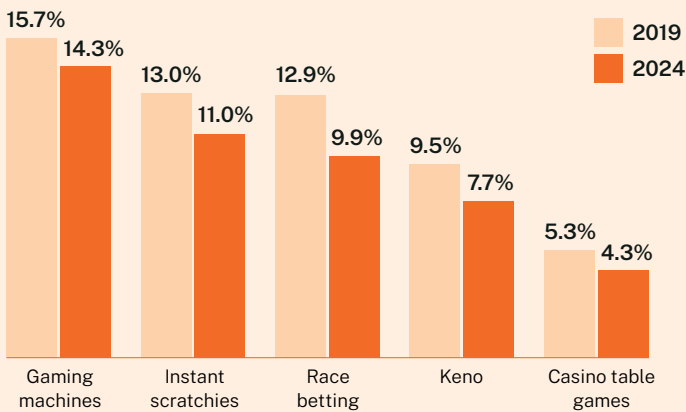
How gambling in NSW is changing

We surveyed 10,000 people from across NSW about gambling, building on surveys conducted in 2019, 2011, and 2006.

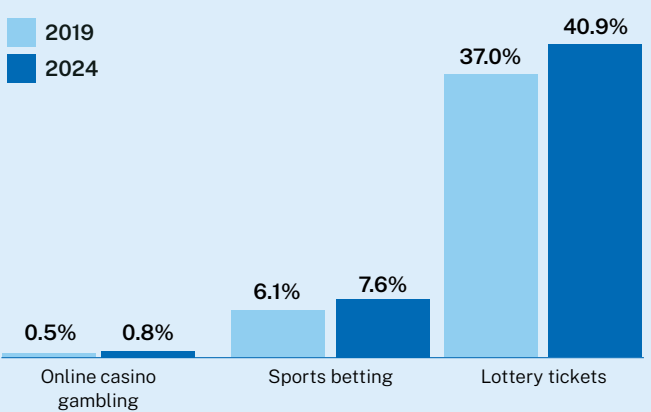
Fewer people were gambling in 2024 than in 2006, but there has been little change since 2019.



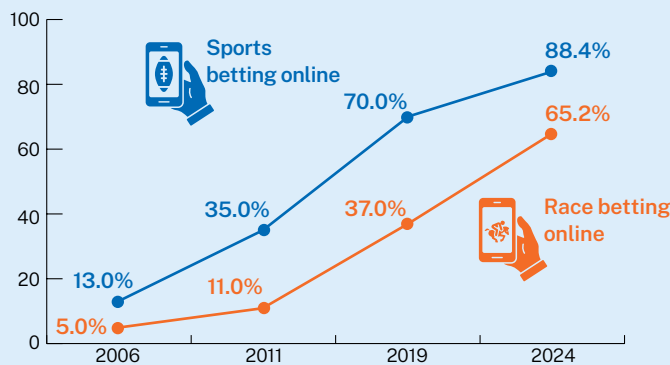
Participation in most forms of gambling has declined since 2019.



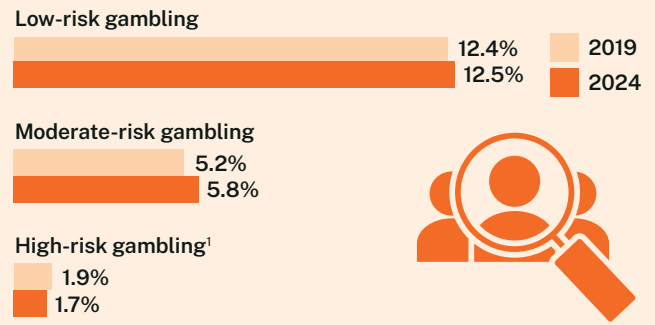
Participation in three forms of gambling has increased.



The number of people betting online continues to grow.



From 2019 to 2024, a stable proportion of people in NSW who gamble have experienced:



1. These are results from the Problem Gambling Severity Index (PGSI). This study uses the term 'high-risk gambling' instead of 'problem gambling', and 'minimal-risk gambling' instead of 'non-problem gambling', to use less stigmatising terminology for people experiencing issues with their gambling.

The NSW Government, through the Office of Responsible Gambling (the Office), develops and implements programs and initiatives that prevent and minimise the risk of gambling harm in the community. The NSW Gambling Survey 2024 was funded through the Responsible Gambling Fund and will inform the work of the Office.
